EUROPEAN ANTI-FRAUD OFFICE

EU BODY MANDATED TO DETECT, INVESTIGATE AND STOP FRAUD WITH EU FUNDS

- ➤ EU expenditure: Structural Funds, agricultural policy and rural development funds, direct expenditure and **external aid**;
- > EU revenue, mainly customs duties;
- Serious misconduct by EU staff and members of the EU institutions

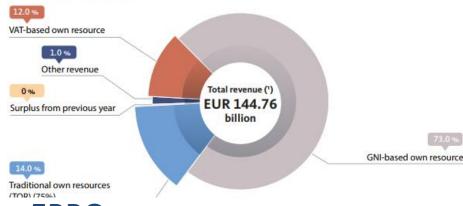
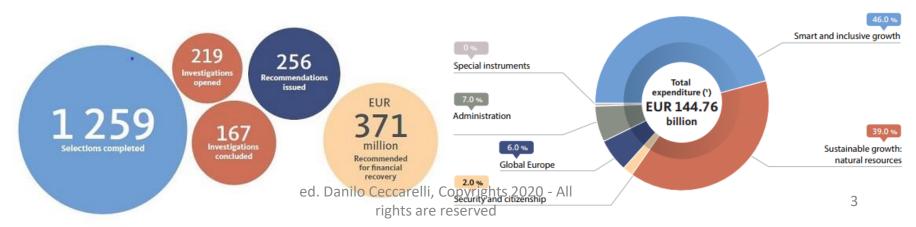


Figure 1: EU expenditure in 2018







OLAF

- Internal investigations: within the EU institutions and bodies
- External investigations: outside the EU institutions and bodies
- Coordination cases: OLAF contributes to investigations by facilitating the gathering and exchange of information and contacts

OLAF and Guardia di Finanza unravel complex scam with EU funds: Operation Paper Castle

OLAF put an end to an intricate fraud scheme through which more than € 1.4 million had been misappropriated.



Investigations took place across several EU Member States.

In Italy, OLAF relied on its close cooperation with Guardia di Finanza.





EPPO

- ➤ The European Public Prosecutor's Office will be an independent and decentralised prosecution office of the European Union
- ➤ Investigate, prosecute and bring to judgment crimes against the EU budget, such as fraud, corruption or serious cross-border VAT fraud
- ➤ 22 participating EU countries
- ➤ REGULATION (EU) 2017/1939 of 12 October 2017 implementing enhanced cooperation on the establishment of the EPPO
- ➤ Directive (EU) 2017/1371 on the fight against fraud to the Union's financial interests



EUROPEAN PUBLIC PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE

STRATEGY



European Chief Prosecutor

(supported by 2 Deputies)

- > Heading the EPPO, organising the work.
- > Contacts EU, EU countries and third parties.



College of Prosecutors

(one European Prosecutor per participating country)

- > Decision-making on strategic matters to ensure coherence, consistency and efficiency within and between cases.
 - > Adoption of internal rules of procedure.

OPERATIONS



Permanent Chambers

(3 members: 2 European Prosecutors and chaired by the Chief Prosecutor, one of the Deputies, or another European Prosecutor)

- > Monitor and direct the investigations and prosecutions by the European Delegated Prosecutors (EDPs).
- > Operational decisions: bringing a case to judgment, dismissing a case, applying simplified procedure, refer case to national authorities, instruct EDPs to initiate investigation or exercise right of evocation.
- > European Prosecutor from the EU countries concerned supervises the EDP on behalf of the Permanent Chamber.



European Delegated Prosecutors (EDPs)

(at least two prosecutors per participating country)

> Responsible for investigating, prosecuting and bringing to judgment cases falling within EPPOS Competence.





EPPO

- First supranational public prosecution office
- ➤ Independent: is not part of the EU institutions and will not take instructions from them or national authorities
- ➤ Will bring cases to <u>National Courts</u>
- Eurojust, OLAF and Europol will maintain their current roles and <u>cooperate closely</u> with the EPPO

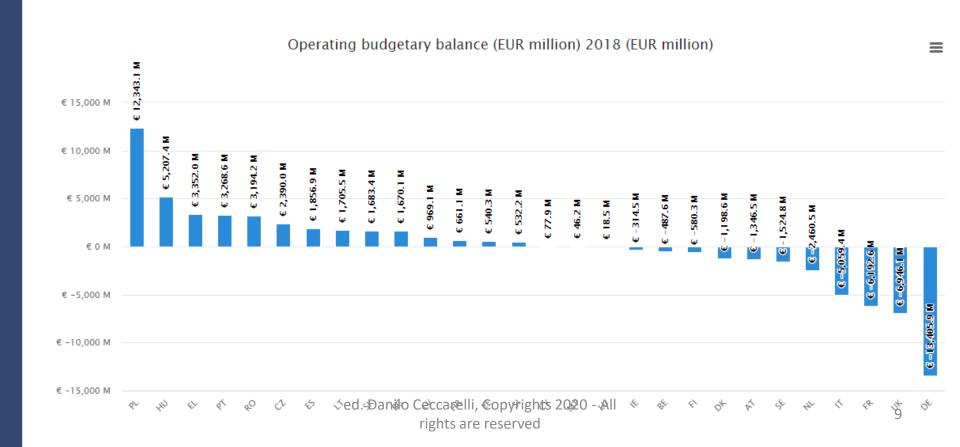




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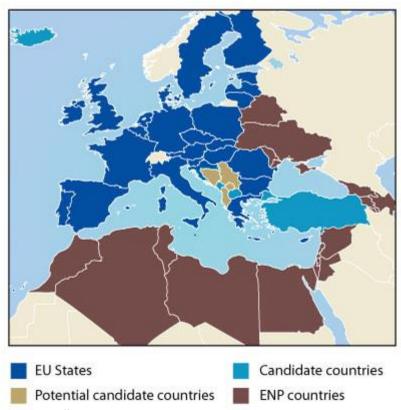

EPPO COOPERATION IN CRIMINAL MATTERS WORKING ARRANGEMENTS ARTICLE 99(3)

- ➤ Liaison officers to the EPPO / contact points
- International agreements...
- > concluded by the Union or to which the Union has acceded
- In the absence...
- ➤ the Member States shall notify the EPPO as a competent authority
- ➤ In the absence...
- ➤ the handling EDP ... may have recourse to the powers of a national prosecutor...
- > on the basis of international agreements concluded by that Member State or applicable national law and...
- where required, through the competent national authorities



OLAF

- International agreements
- Stabilisation and Association Agreement IPA
- ➤ Individual Financing Agreements
- ➤ OLAF clause: programmes, actions and subsequent contracts shall be subject to supervision, control and audit by EU agencies, including OLAF
- Right to access information and to conduct on-the-spot check

Investigations 2018: Jordan (2), Kenya (2), Ecuador (2), North Macedonia (2), Syria (2), Ukraine (2), Gabon (2), Belarus, Central African Republic, Egypt, Eritrea, Guatemala, Guinea-Bissau, Ivory Coast, Morocco, Mozambique, Myanmar, Russia, Sierra Leone, Turkey, Uganda, Yemen
