


















EUROPEAN UNION-WESTERN BALKANSCooperation on Justice and Home Affairs

The **EUWEB Module**, hosted by the University of Salerno, offers a three-year specialization course in EU Cooperation on Justice and Home Affairs with the Western Balkans in view of their accession to the Union. The Module introduces an innovative and multidisciplinary approach in EU legal studies, and promotes excellence in teaching EU issues related to immigration, the fight against transnational crime, police and judicial cooperation, and the protection of fundamental rights with the Western Balkans by bringing them closer to the Union.

Target groups: students, graduates, Ph.D. candidates, legal operators, judges, lawyers, law enforcement officials, civil servants, civil society, and policymakers.

Training activities: the Module consists of **58 hours per year** of training courses that will take place each Friday from **2:30 PM** to **7 PM**. p.m. from **March** to **June 2021**.

Lessons will be carried out online, through the "Microsoft Teams" app.

The activities will be held by Key Staff Members and national and international experts.

Module topics

- European integration process, enlargement, and cooperation with the Western Balkans: EU internal and external security
- Definition and management of European borders, migration flows, search and rescue operations at sea, and cooperation with Frontex
- Asylum and international protection in the European Union: recognition procedures and reform of the Dublin Regulation
- Strategies to combat illegal immigration and the role of Balkan Countries: expulsion and refoulement of illegal migrants
- EU migration policies, crimes against humanity, and the International Criminal Court
- Human trafficking and other crimes related to migrants' illegal status. Role of transnational organized crime, precautionary tools, and interoperability between systems in light of Regulation (EU) 2019/818

- Terrorism, countering radicalization, and transnational crimes: investigation techniques, evidence gathering, and the role of Europol
- Cooperation in the fight against corruption, money laundering, tax fraud, and cybercrime: the role of Eurojust, OLAF and EPPO
- Exchange of information, intelligence activities, and Joint Investigation Teams (JITs) in international cooperation between investigative and judicial authorities
- Recognition and enforcement of foreign convictions, strengthening procedural rights, and ne bis in idem
- Democratic principles and the rule of law as conditions for EU membership.
- Respect for fundamental rights and Western Balkans' compliance with EU standards
