1. Preliminary Activities

1.1 Erasmus Days

On 15th October 2020 the Jean Monnet Modules EUWEB and Solidarity in EU Law (SoEULaw) celebrated #Erasmusplusdays with a jointly organised webinar.

The event aimed to increase dialogue between the two Jean Monnet communities: **sharing** ideas, experiences and best practices.

'Planning and Enhancing EU-Western Balkans Cooperation on Justice and Home Affairs' through a series of **online informal meetings.**

The meetings hosted our partners as well as various academics, legal experts and stakeholders in order to discuss new trends and perspectives of the topics for the EUWEB Module's second edition.

These events also saw the participation of our civil society supporters, such as ELSA and FIDU.

1. Preliminary Activities *1.3 SoEULaw Round Table in Cooperation with EUWEB Module*

On 10th December 2020, **SoEULaw** Jean Monnet had successful round table concerning "COVID-19 and Solidarity Beyond Law".

This did just not represent one more case of cooperation between the two modules but, above all, an occasion to address COVID-19'issued, calling upon all the involved actors' solidarity and responsibility.

2.1. Establishment of the New Secretariat for the Second Edition and Legal Observatory

- ✓ Pure basic research: research of documents, sources and judgements;
- ✓ Strategic basic research: selection of documents, sources and judgements in order to undertaken to acquire new knowledge;
- ✓ Applied research: elaboration of original work undertaken primarily to acquire new knowledge with a specific application in view;
- ✓ Experimental development: elaboration of systematic work, using existing knowledge gained from research or practical experience.



2.1. Establishment of the New Secretariat for the Second Edition and Legal Observatory

A different and **even more scientific role** has been given to the **Legal Observatory**. The Legal Observatory is meant to **heavily focus on research, analysis and elaboration of data**.

It is entrusted to **not only** support the research activities used to prepare the Module's lectures, **but also** to monitor eventual developments in Europe, reporting any substantial change or move in the EU-WB chessboard. This is indeed defined by the editing of EUWEB's Bulletin (See point 3.5).

3.1 EUVaDis' Conference

On 21 April 2021 EUWEB's Module Leader, Prof. Teresa Russo, took part as main speaker on "The Democratic Principles in EU Legal Order: A Reality or a Challenge?" in the Session 3 "Democracy and European Citizenship in the EU" of **the online Conference** "EU Values, Diversity and Intercultural Dialogue: Enhancing the Debate" organized by the Jean Monnet Project "Enhancing the Debate about Intercultural Dialogue, EU Values and Diversity" (EUVaDis).



3.2 Elaboration of Papers, Selection and Publication

3.2 Elaboration of Papers, Selection and Publication 3.2.1 Recognition of ECTS

- Foreign students, who participated to the EUWEB Module and presented a final paper, subject to evaluation by the Module's Teaching Staff Members, have been recognized the number of 6 (six) ECTs;
- Students of the Department of Legal Sciences of the University of Salerno, who participated in the Module and submit a final paper have been recognized from 2 (two) to 6 (six) ECTs as required for the performance of "other activities" pursuant to Article 10, Paragraph 5 - Letter a) of the Ministerial Decree No. 270/2004;



3.2 Elaboration of Papers, Selection and Discussion 3.2.1 Recognition of ECTS

 The number of ECTs has been decided by the Commission composed of the Module's Teaching Staff Members on the basis of the students' participation in the lectures (at least 70%) and substantial assessment of the submitted paper.



3.3 Credits for Lawyers

Thanks to an agreement reached with the Bar Association of Salerno, lawyers who participate in the Module activities have been awarded 4 (four) credits for each training course.

For international conferences, the number of credits has been increased in proportion to the hours of activity.



3.4 Certificates for Civil Servants and Other Categories

Legal operators, law enforcement officials, police officers, civil servants (as well as similar categories) participation in the EUWEB Module is equivalent to professional updating.



3.5 Bullettin

For the second edition of Module, the Legal Observatory and the Secretariat have been starting a monitor-andupdate activity on monthly basis.

Gathered meaningful updates are enshrined in the Open Sources section of the EUWEB Module website (www.euweb.org), where 5 (five) distinct sub-sections of the Bulletin can be found.

The sections are resembling EUWEB's macro-areas (*Cross-Border Security – Migration and Asylum Management; Cooperation in the Fight Against Transnational Crime; Judicial and Police Cooperation; Cooperation and Protection of Fundamental Rights*) plus an extra "miscellanea" section.

3.7.2 Upcoming Book – Springer (publ.)

The research, carried out within the EUWEB Module, has been translated into an editorial project, i.e., a monograph.

This project was submitted to the Springer publishing which approved its publication scheduled for 2022.

The EUWEB agreed with Albanian University of Tirana, one of its key partners, also within the International Credit Mobility (ICM) Programme on the **publication of a special issue of the Optime Scientific Law Journal**.

The OPTIME Journal is **open access**.
