The EUWEB Module, hosted by the University of Salerno, offers a specialization course in EU Cooperation on Justice and Home Affairs with the Western Balkans in view of their accession to the Union. The Module introduces an innovative and multidisciplinary approach in EU legal studies, and promotes excellence in teaching EU issues related to immigration, the fight against transnatio-nal crime, police and judicial cooperation, and the protection of fundamental rights with the Western Balkans by bringing them closer to the Union.
